
- Knit or crochet a gradient.

- Weave iridescence.
- Weave a rainbow.
- Felt a rainbow.
- Dye a rainbow.

- Weave a basket rainbow.
- Or come up with an option of your choice.

I'm working furiously on my project. I'm determined to have it finished in time this year!
