Association of Northwest Weavers' Guilds held the annual members meeting on June 20, 2025 on zoom and at the conference in Yakima. New officers were introduced: President – Patty Huffer; Vice President – Joelle Dubois; 2nd Vice President – Malcolm Benson Dyke; Treasurer – Angelique Penaflor; Secretary – Jennifer Bogut. Discussion included: ANWG Grants – Annual or Biannual; review of changes to the By-laws and Standing Procedures; adding a board position of Technology Director for the web master; location of the next conference in 2027 [location remains undecided]. It was very inspiring to see such a bigger horizon of possibility in weaving. I have a lot of ideas to experiment with and continue to learn more about. It was also super fun to hang out with our guild people in a different setting.

RORY: It was a really awesome experience to have so many weavers from all over the country and all walks of life come together to teach, learn and share their experiences. I attended a really great class and learned a lot, and met some really cool people.

Everyone was so positive and willing to share information that they know and ask about what they don't know. What an environment! Then there were the two crazy gals who shared a room next to Kathie Leigh and me who were always organizing social gatherings in our little courtyard - including us in their vast network of friends from their many years of weaving and organizing workshops.
